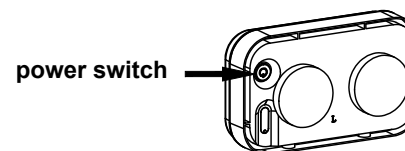
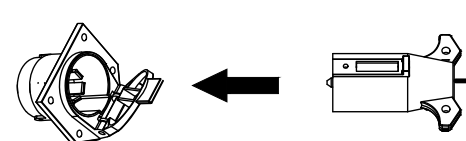
Pairing Instruction:

The product was paired before it went out. However, if the pair is not connected due to special reasons, please follow the following instructions to re-pair.

This product uses wireless 2.4 GHz technology to send and receive commands. One transmitter can control multiple lights at the same time, but one light can only receive signal from one transmitter. If you need to replace the transmitter or one of the lights or want to add an additional light, you must perform the following steps to code the implementation between the transmitter and the same type of light.

Re-pair:

1. Turn on vehicle
2. Set vehicle running light or hazard light is on, make sure the transmitter get the power.
3. Once plug transmitter into vehicle please press power button on one of the wireless lights immediately



4. Now one of the lights is matched.
5. Please Repeat process for second light
